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ACT 2Scene 1: Relationships

Lights up on six chairs that three sets of couples will inhabit. The couples should move chairs in-between sections to signify their status in their relationship. This means the chairs should not be in a row. Gay: Cameron and Grant / Lesbian: Nikki and Shelby / Straight: Ben and Carly

MOMENTS: RELATIONSHIPS: MCKENNA

We wanted to take a look at relationships and the dynamic that happens between two people during their four year high school experience. It's such a major part of our day to day lives. We talked with people and asked them to tell us their experiences, their ups and downs, and the major issues that they have as they weave in and out of each other's lives. Enter average three couples, three average relationships, and three different perceptions on High School Relationships; which are anything but average.

(Phase 1: Cat and mouse)

MCKENNA:

So tell me about the day you met

CARLY:

CAMERON:

I knew he was a little apprehensive and it was going to take some trust so one day after class I invited him to come to GSA and that's that

MCKENNA:

Phase 2: Facebook official

Okay Ready: 3,2,1

SHELBY:

Relationship Request: Confirm or Ignore

GRANT:

Relationship request: confirm that you are in a relationship with\_\_\_\_\_: Ignore

CAMERON:

I sent him a relationship request; he sends me a text message.

GRANT:

I wanted to explain that I wasn't comfortable with having everyone know; but how do you say that in a text message so I said hey can you call me and we sorted everything out.

CAMERON:

I got the text and I'm not gonna lie, my stomach dropped but I talked to him and I wasn't completely okay with it but I told him I understood and it was fine...for now

BEN:

CARLY:

BEN:

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CARLY:

BEN:

So after three days I text her "I thought we were in a relationship" and I added one of those smiley face things so she wouldn't think I was mad at her

CARLY:

I was confused at first and then I got it and thought it was cute; so I hit confirm

MCKENNA:

Phase 2: Good Times and Bad Times

CAMERON:

Everything was great when we were alone and by alone I mean anywhere where we wouldn't run into someone that knew him; which was basically my house or clear across town. And that was fine for a while but then it was like I was dating two different people or rather I was dating one and didn't even know the other.

GRANT:

It must have been hard for him looking back on it; but I thought I made it pretty clear at the beginning that I wanted to keep our relationship private and he knew that.

CAMERON:

And I let it go on like that for a long time pretending like I didn't care. Actually, there was even a period of time where I tried to just pretend that we were good friends when we were at school and I would try to talk to him or sit with him at lunch and things were just awkward. GRANT:

CAMERON:

I stood there for a long time because I knew at that moment I had to make a decision and at that moment I knew that something had to give because I couldn't continue to do this. And I got that text he sent me; just because you add a smiley face on a text doesn't mean everything's better: It just means I realize that I'm being a big...whatever

SHELBY:

Relationships in high school are funny. One of my favorite things is when you go on Facebook and the status says "I'm in a relationship and it's complicated. I mean really all relationships are complicated because you're dealing with emotions and when emotions are involved; it's never easy.

NIKKI:

I'm not going to say our relationship was perfect or some sort of fairy tale romance; one: because that's just ridiculous and two: the rough patches are fun in their own sort of way; I mean at the time they suck but it's all part of it. I see so many people around here who get wrapped up in each other so quickly that they lose themselves in the mix of things and we didn't want to do that.

SHELBY:

Not only themselves but their friends as well; it happens all the time that girls just dump their friends when they get a guy. There should be some balance in relationship; why does it have to be an all or nothing situation? You ditch your friends, even your best friends and then you break up with the guy and look what happens; you're left with no one it's sad really.

CARLY:

People always ask why and how but I guess it was hard to see what was happening at the time and when you get lost in this thing that we call love you are blinded to things for so long.

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BEN:

I've always been protective, I guess that's the word for it

CARLY:

It was small things at first, asking who I was texting, what I was doing, who I was with and at the beginning I thought he was just being considerate; you know trying to take an active part in my life. And then things just got worse

BEN:

She doesn't need to anyone but me; it's about us; it's about being together.

CARLY:

I wasn't allowed to do things without him, hang out with friends or just go anywhere that wasn't my house. And I remember that at first I started to argue with him and he would get so mad. It would come out of nowhere.

BEN:

CARLY:
